Europemobility Network 2012 International Conference in Paris

Europemobility Network will organize three annual International Conferences in different countries, in order to maximise the impact of the project across Europe.

The first Europemobility Network International Conference will take place on 21 November 2012 in Paris whereas the Award Ceremony of the Video Contest will be held the following day within the framework of the Salon Européen de l'Education.



The conference is hosted by La Ligue de l'enseignement

La Ligue de l'enseignement is a large non-formal and formal education network founded in 1866. Today, it gathers 1,6 Mio members in more than 30,000 associations in 102 departmental and 22 regional federations. All pursue the common aim of enabling access to education, culture and sports for everyone regardless of their age or social and ethnic background. Together, they work against all forms of inequality and encourage citizens to actively participate in society, to know and fulfill their duties and make full use of their rights in order to reinforce a democratic, humanist and social society. Its members further promote solidarity amongst citizens, sustainable development and respect for our planet.

Every year since 1998, La Ligue organises the Salon européen de l'éducation, France's largest fair on education and training. In 2011, 550,000 visitors had the possibility of meeting stakeholders from local and national authorities as well as the professional, higher and non-formal education sectors.

Interview with the Thematic Commission on Quality

One of the Thematic Commissions of the “Europemobility Network” is centered around Quality Assurance in Mobility. This thematic Commission is led by the European Vocational Training Association (EVTA), located in Brussel and represented by Pauline van den Bosch and Institute of Interdisciplinary Research e.V. (inter.research) from Germany represented by Eva-Maria Kropp and Thomas Berger. EVTA and inter.research have extensive and complementary experiences in mobility and in quality assurance processes and they are focused respectively on Vocational Education and Training and Higher Education.

According to you, why is this Thematic Commission important?

“This collaboration between different educational sector makes the Thematic Commission rich and valuable: Lifelong learning is not related to time, place nor institutes. However, promoters of placement mobility used to stay within their sector – reflected by programmes such as Erasmus, Leonardo or Grundtvig mobility.” The Europemobility Network crosses these boundaries and work on a common objective: how to ensure both quality and quantity of placement mobility for all learners?”

Can you briefly explain what the Thematic Commission is all about?

“The Thematic Commission brings representatives from vocational, adult/non-formal and higher education on one table to collect and study existing approaches on quality and to develop common measures to ensure the quality of practical training and to increase the number of learners, who benefit from it.

“It seems that there are a lot of existing practices in quality assurance in mobility which have proven to be

effective.” The Thematic Commission intends to look at these practices more in detail and to find out why they are successful, what kind of quality assurance is addressed and how this information can be used in the context of the Europemobility Network. For example, some of the quality assurance approaches are focused on an ex-ante quality control, with the focus on the quality of placement organization, while others are more focused on the process, with the focus on supporting tools to promote quality in mobility and others on an award of excellence in an ex-post context.

This desk research” will be strengthened by “field-research” by a cycle of workshops organized to get more inputs on successful initiatives and feedback on the work of the Thematic Commission.

One of the final products will be the “Quality Toolbox”. How can people make use of this quality toolbox?

The “Quality Toolbox” is a framework which makes clear the relation and synergies between the different good practices. It is based on the “EQAVET framework” with the four phases in quality assurance: Planning, Implementation, Evaluation, Review. The idea is that quality assurance can only work when there are concrete actions established in ALL these four phases. This quality assurance model is applied for the context of mobility: for each of the four phases, criteria (“how to realize quality”) and indicators and benchmarks (“how to measure quality”) are set up. The good practices and cases are linked to each of these phases and can help the users in their challenge to improve quality and quantity in mobility.

Users can see this toolbox as a checklist: while a checklist suggests the user to “tick all items”, the quality Toolbox allows to choose and select the items which are the most appropriate for their context. “What works in one context, doesn’t necessarily works in another context.”

Since their introduction in 1987, European mobility programmes supporting work placements abroad have registered a constant but modest increase in the number of beneficiaries.

Still a low percentage of youngsters in Europe go abroad as part of their educational path. A multiplier effects is required if we are to achieve the objective of making learning mobility a reality for all.

Europemobility Network aims at establishing a strategic framework and the conditions allowing key players of learning mobility in Europe to cooperate and create synergies focused on raising quality and quantity of work placements abroad.
